The Work Programme envisaged in this document	<p>General remark: Referring to the 11 generic areas for which ENTSOG will be requested to draft Network Codes, the issues can be interpreted from the market or technical view. EC confirmed towards CEN that the scope of ENTSOG is limited to market aspects whilst CEN is also in future in charge to provide the necessary technical standards. With view to experiences on national and European level, CEN/TC 234 sees the need to generally clarify the boundaries between these aspects in order to build interfaces where appropriate. CEN/TC 234 is willing to support this process.</p> <p>Furthermore, CEN/TC 234 informs about discussions with EC DG TREN which resulted in the task to provide definitions for general terms such as technical standard, network code, technical harmonisation ..... but also to support the clarification of specific terms which could cause conflicts between technical standardisation and market harmonisation. CEN/TC 234 appreciates the already started discussions with GTE+ on the issue.</p> <p>Also with ERGEG an information exchange on the issue is scheduled for September 2008.</p> <p>For further information CEN/TC 234 attaches a CD Rom with the available CEN/TC 234 Technical Standards on Gas Infrastructure.</p>
